As a therapist, counselor, or advocate, it is certain that you will work with a survivor of sexual assault. Knowing how to create a safe and open space for disclosures, being knowledgeable about a survivor's medical and legal options, and having tools to provide sexual trauma-based therapeutic interventions, is crucial to a survivor's healing process.

Compared with people who have not experienced sexual assault or rape, survivors are

- 3x more likely to suffer from depression
- 13x more likely to attempt suicide
- 26x more likely to abuse drugs
